(PBIS) Positive Behavior Intervention & Support

Dear Parent/Guardians:

Prairie View Elementary School has always strived to create a safe and positive learning environment for all students. In an effort to continue to improve our school climate, Prairie View has joined the state wide PBIS consortium to implement a comprehensive Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) Plan. The primary goal of this plan is to create a shared culture that fosters a school environment that is positive, predictable, consistent and safe.

Research has shown that when positive behavior frameworks such as PBIS are in place, schools see improved academic performance, increased student engagement and a reduction of problem behaviors. Through explicit instruction, acknowledgement and a variety of engaging activities, students will learn the school wide expectations of Be Safe, Be Responsible and Be Kind. Not only will students have ample opportunities to practice and model positive behavior, they will also have the opportunity to create and participate in fun activities that promote our school wide expectations.

In addition to teaching expected behavior, we will display posters around the building and create videos to continually promote positive behavior.

This matrix will be taught during the first month of school. During the year, we ask that you follow up with your child to review and reinforce the PBIS expectations with your family. Ask your child if they understand the expectations in different locations around the school or on the bus. Practice the school wide expectations at home and encourage your child to be safe, responsible, and kind.

Working together to promote positive behavior helps increase student achievement. Research shows that when the home and school work together, student learning is more successful. We look forward to an exciting school year full of new learning.
