A COMMUNITY VISION FOR **STRONG, SAFE** **SCHOOLS AND SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS**

Eden Prairie Schools staff, parents and community members spent the last three years developing a long-term vision for academic programs and facilities to support student learning. Based on that public input, research and planning, the School Board is asking voters to consider a one-question bond referendum to:



Ensure more children are prepared for kindergarten by moving our 4-year-old preschool programs into all elementary schools, thus expanding access and strengthening the transition from preschool to elementary school. Preschool will remain a fee-based program.



Improve the middle school learning experience by moving 6th graders from the elementary schools to a more age-appropriate environment at a grades 6-8 middle school tailored to their academic and developmental needs.



Support greater academic achievement by redesigning many classrooms across the district to support a more flexible learning environment and personalized learning. Combined with our exceptional staff, these improvements would help students develop in-demand skills like collaboration, creativity, communication and critical thinking.



Improve safety and security across all schools by adding protective glass, lock-down equipment, internal communication systems and additional exterior security.

Notice is hereby given that a special election has been called and will be held in and for Independent School District No. 272 (Eden Prairie Schools), Hennepin County, Minnesota, on May 14, 2019, on the following question:

On May 14, 2019, Eden Prairie School District residents will be asked to vote on a one-question bond funding proposal to improve school learning environments and enhance school safety through construction projects at all schools.

This request is based on three years of planning, research and community input that resulted in a long-term vision for academic programs and facilities to support student learning.

SCHOOL DISTRICT BALLOT QUESTION APPROVAL OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BUILDING BONDS

Shall the school board of Independent School District No. 272 (Eden Prairie Public Schools) be authorized to issue general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$39,900,000 to provide funds for the acquisition or betterment of school sites and facilities, including without limitation safety and security improvements at each school site, building additions or updates at the middle school and preschool levels, and Districtwide building updates to support personalized learning early-childhood through twelfth grade?

YOU ARE VOTING FOR A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.**

Voters must approve bond funds needed to pay for major building and construction projects.

The goals of the construction projects are to: ensure more children are ready for kindergarten, improve the middle school experience, support greater academic achievement, and provide all schools with security improvements and flexible learning spaces.

The estimated tax impact for the average homeowner would be about \$6.50 per month (\$397,400 median value home).

TAX COMPARISON CHART

We have the **second lowest total school property taxes** of neighboring and Lake Conference school districts - and will still be below the state average if voters approve this funding request.

What will it cost?

Voter approval of this referendum would give the School Board permission to issue \$39.9 million in bonds to fund construction and materials needed. The tax impact for the average homeowner* would be about **\$6.50 per month**.
