# EAGLE ZONE

## School Age Care Summer Program

Eagle Zone provides a fun, safe and enriching environment for youth throughout summer. The program focuses on creating an environment that is respectful, inclusive and nurturing for youth in Kindergarten through 6th grade. Children enrolled in Eagle Zone have the freedom to explore their interests, be physically active and socialize with their peers.

On a daily basis, Eagle Zone offers coordinated activities in the areas of arts and crafts, STEM experiments, service projects, fitness activities and much more. The program also takes field trips on a weekly basis and incorporates special events throughout the course of the summer.

### EAGLE ZONE: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Eagle Zone's full-day summer program begins at 6:15 AM and ends at 6:00 PM. There are two additional registration options available to families who are also attending EPIC. More information regarding Eagle Zone registration options for families who are also enrolled in EPIC can be found on page 9 of this catalog.

#### **When does Eagle Zone summer registration open?**

Summer programming opens online at 8:00 AM on February 8th.

#### **What are the qualifying ages to enroll in the program?**

Children entering kindergarten next fall through children who will be completing sixth grade this spring are eligible to enroll in the program.

#### **What are the dates that the program will be running?**

The program runs from June 12th to August 16th and is CLOSED July 4th & 5th.

#### **How much will Eagle Zone cost in the summer?**

Full-day Eagle Zone Programming costs \$45/day per child for a standard rate. If the child is registered within three days of the date of care, that is considered a "drop-in". The drop-in rate is \$52/day per child, and subject to availability. There are additional options for families who are also enrolling in EPIC. More information can be found on page 9.

#### **What type of schedule do I need to commit to?**

Families must register for a minimum of 5 days throughout the course of the summer. Families can "pick their days" based on when they need care.

#### **Will snacks be provided?**

Eagle Zone will provide a morning and afternoon snack. Children who wish to have an additional snack are encouraged to bring a healthy option from home.

#### **Do children need to bring a lunch?**

Children must bring a bag lunch and beverage, unless otherwise noted. There may be some field trips where a lunch is provided, but parents will be notified ahead of time when that is to happen. Lunches should be dry bag lunches, with no refrigeration requirements. If this changes, families will be notified by the site staff.

Targeted Services qualified students are eligible for free bus transportation to and from morning camps for the first seven weeks of EPIC. Registrations MUST be received by May 28 to receive transportation.

## EPIC Summer Camp FAQs

### WELCOME TO EPIC SUMMER CAMP

Eden Prairie Schools Community Education is proud to offer EPIC Summer Camp, which is a youth program designed to be flexible, affordable and full of fun! EPIC also includes Targeted Services. Targeted Services is a state-funded program designed to create programming that ensures each student reaches their academic goals. Students are referred to the Targeted Services program by their classroom teacher.

### REGISTRATION DEADLINE

Registrations are due by midnight the Wednesday before camp starts. Registration for Targeted Services referrals are due by May 28 in order to receive transportation.

### DROP OFF AND PICK UP

All youth need to be signed in and out every day by a parent/guardian between 8-9 a.m. and 4-5 p.m. at Oak Point/Eagle Heights Gym B. Students attending morning-only camps must be picked up by 12:30 p.m. Drop-off for students attending afternoon-only camps begins at 12:30 p.m.

### CHECK-IN AND CHECK-OUT

Children will be released to authorized persons only or escorted to their Targeted Services bus. If a child is to be picked up by anyone other than the legal guardian, written notification must be given to EPIC staff. Please include multiple emergency contacts when registering.

### LUNCH AND SNACKS

If your child is staying all day, they will need to bring a lunch and drink. We will store all lunches in the refrigerator. We also suggest that your child brings a snack and water bottle for each camp they are attending. Please be aware that there may be occasions where you are asked to bring non-peanut items due to allergies within the group.

### SUNSCREEN

Please apply sunscreen prior to your child attending camp. You are welcome to send sunscreen with your child if they are staying all day. EPIC staff will supervise the application of sunscreen but cannot help your child apply sunscreen. We will assist in helping students apply sunscreen to their upper back if requested.

### SUPERVISED DURING NON-CAMP CARE TIMES

EPIC staff will supervise drop-off, lunch, and pick up time periods outside the regular camp times at no cost to you. During these times, youth have the option to participate in activities until their parents arrive, or next camp begins.

### LATE PICK UP FEES

EPIC closes at 5 p.m. each day. Any child picked up after 5 p.m. is subject to a late fee of \$1 per minute.

### WEATHER POLICY

All camps have rain backups in place, so schedules will run as normal.

### EPIC STAFF

They are dedicated professionals whose main focus is safe, fun experiences for your child.

### STAFF RATIOS

EPIC staff will follow state guidelines for out-of-school time ratios, which are 15 to 1. Camps for 4-year-olds follow a 10 to 1 ratio.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Yes, fee assistance is available for qualified families. Visit [www.edenpr.org/feeassistance](http://www.edenpr.org/feeassistance).

### GRADES

Grades listed are entering grades for the 19-20 school year. PreK youth must be age 4 by the start of camp.

### CAMP LOCATION

All camps are hosted at Oak Point / Eagle Heights Elementary School.

### BUS TRANSPORTATION

Targeted services-qualified students are eligible for free bus transportation to and from morning camps.

### REFUND POLICY

If you need to cancel, please notify us at 952-975-6940 and we will refund your camp fee minus a \$5 processing fee. No refunds can be given on or after the start of camp.

## DOES YOUR FAMILY NEED CHILD CARE ON FRIDAYS OR BEFORE AND AFTER YOUR EPIC CAMPS?

Eden Prairie Schools Community Education’s Eagle Zone program has options to fit your family’s needs. Eagle Zone is designed as a ‘pick-your-days’ program to allow families to choose a schedule that works for them. Register for EPIC and Eagle Zone separately and select the desired options during the Eagle Zone registration process. Families will need to commit to a minimum of 5 days for the summer, and the 5 days can be a combination of the options that are available.

### EPIC Morning–Eagle Zone Afternoon

If you are enrolled in a morning EPIC camp and need afternoon care at Eagle Zone, the daily rate will be \$25 per child. This rate will be presented as an option during the registration process for Eagle Zone. Families must register three days before the date they wish to receive care.

### Eagle Zone Early Morning Care

If you only need care before EPIC, that is available with a daily rate of \$10 per child. This rate applies to families who need care early in the morning prior to attending EPIC and it can be combined with the EPIC Morning–Eagle Zone Afternoon option. Families must register three days before the date they wish to receive care.

Families have the option of selecting both sessions when registering, the daily rate is then \$35/child.

If you need care all day on Friday, the Eagle Zone Full-Day daily rate is \$45/child, unless the day is requested within three business days, then it is \$52/child.

## What you need to know about



# TARGETED SERVICES

Children can qualify to attend select camps for FREE this summer based on classroom teacher recommendations through a program called Targeted Services. These classes are identified with a ★. Funding for your child's participation is provided by the State of Minnesota's Targeted Services program. Participation is optional and at the discretion of parents.

Camps are taught by licensed teachers and designed to support academic and social skills in a supportive and fun atmosphere. Student choice is an important aspect of engaged learning. Our camps cover a wide variety of topic areas and meet district academic standards. Though it may sound on the surface like just a fun camp, the curriculum is well thought out and designed to meet your student's academic needs, encompassed in a fun theme.

Our goal is to provide a program that enhances student engagement, creates meaningful experiences and supports students' academic goals. To keep your child's mind active all summer long, we recommend signing up for at least four camps.

### How do I know if my child was referred?

Students are referred by their classroom teacher. If you have questions about your child's referral, please contact their teacher.

### What does it cost?

Referred students are invited to attend the selected morning camps at no cost. You are welcome to also register for afternoon camps. Afternoon camps start at \$69.

### How many sessions does my child need to attend?

It's completely your choice. We do ask that students who qualify for Targeted Services enroll in at least four weeks of camps. This allows us adequate time with your student to continue to develop their skills.

### Is transportation available?

Targeted services qualified students are eligible for free bus transportation to and from morning camps. However, all children who require transportation must sign up before May 28.

### Can a sibling not in a Targeted Services Camp take the Targeted Services bus?

If you have additional children attending morning EPIC summer camps, they are invited to ride the Targeted Services bus. Siblings must have completed kindergarten in order to ride the bus. Please register them online by May 28.

### When do I drop off and pick up?

If you're not riding the bus, all youth need to be signed in and out every day by a parent/guardian at Oak Point/Eagle Heights Gym B. Students attending morning-only camps must be picked up by 12:30 PM. Drop-off for students attending afternoon-only camps begins at 12:30 PM.

### How does check-in and check-out work?

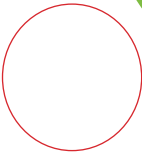
