 -What is a Connect 9 Leader? Our Connect 9 leadership team welcomes our 9th grade students to EPHS! Each Connect 9 leader will be assigned to a small group of 7-10 freshmen to answer questions and run Freshman Orientation on September 3rd. Connect 9 Leaders give valuable EPHS insight and will meet monthly with these freshmen about a variety of topics during Connections. Connect 9 leadership positions are open for juniors and seniors in the 2024-25 school year.
