- **Connect 9 leader applications are now available** on Schoology for current 10th and 11th grade students!
 -What is a Connect 9 Leader? Our Connect 9 leadership team welcomes our 9th grade students to EPHS! Each Connect 9 leader will be assigned to a small group of 7-10 freshmen to answer questions and run Freshman Orientation on September 3rd. Connect 9 Leaders give valuable EPHS insight and will meet monthly with these freshmen about a variety of topics during Connections. Connect 9 Leadership positions are open for juniors and seniors in the 2024-25 school year. These positions are incredibly valuable to EPHS, as we create a transition and an experience to ensure each of our students can answer YES to our three questions: Do I Belong Here? Is this Meaningful? Can I do this?
 -What is the time commitment? You must be able to commit to:
 * 4 hour required summer training in August (Dates TBD)
 * Freshman Orientation 7:30 am- 3:30 pm on Tuesday September 3rd, which is the first day of school (this is mandatory).
 * You will also be required to meet with your Freshman Connections group once a month during Connections time. This means you must be able to attend each of these Connections sessions **(cannot be in PSEO or Online out of the building)**.
